



1:1 Teacher for VI student

PURPOSE OF THE ROLE

To work directly as a one-to-one teaching support with staff to successfully support educational and social development of a visually impaired pupil.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- To support a visually impaired student with accessibility requirements currently at KS2 level curriculum.
- To ensure timely student access to the curriculum by providing curriculum materials in a format accessible to the student
- Work with the class teachers, other supporting staff and parents to establish an appropriate learning environment that enables the student to access the curriculum and learn effectively
- Support the planning, evaluation and adjustments of lessons so the student is included in a range of school activities.
- Secure curriculum materials and planning from staff, reproduce materials and resources into an appropriate format that supports and motivates the student into using them following the guidance of the QTVI
- To engage regularly with QTVI and advising teachers and colleagues in lighting, modification on any additional equipment. To use materials and skills that encourage independent learning and behaviour.
- Support the use of ICT (including specialist ICT for visually impaired students) in learning activities and develop the students' competence and independence in its use.
- Determine the need for, prepare and maintain, plus order when appropriate, general and specialist equipment and resources to ensure learning targets and outcomes can be achieved.
- To work individually and in a group or class environment to support learning.
- To work with form teacher, other supporting staff, parents and other relevant members of staff on content, delivery and outcomes of lessons.
- To work with the class teacher, other supporting staff and QTVI as required to plan and deliver appropriate provision and training.
- To communicate daily with parents and form teacher, QTVI.
- To follow and implement the school's rules and policies, including those on behaviour and safeguarding
- To participate in school activities, attend meetings and training and perform supervision duties as appropriate
- To be aware of the school safeguarding policy and to act according to its instruction
- To comply with and assist with the development of policies and procedures relating to child protection, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, reporting concerns to an appropriate person
- To contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the school
- To establish constructive relationships and communicate with other agencies /professionals, in liaison with the teacher, to support achievement and progress.
- To take the initiative to develop appropriate approaches to supporting the student.

- To recognise own strengths and areas of specialist expertise and use these to lead, advise and support others
- To support the student in extracurricular activities such as trips and clubs.
- To perform other duties that the Head teacher considers reasonable, that are commensurate with the post
- To be punctual and diligent in the execution of duties.
- To have a strong interest in CPD the area of VI education and proactively seek training in any aspect required to achieve this.
- A teaching qualification and previous experience in teaching KS2 curriculum is preferred
- Strong proficiency in IT is required.
- This is a long term position with the intention for the purpose in this role to support child as they go through the school.
