Scope of Service

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT

Self Employed - The VMT is a self-employed person and responsible for all income tax and National Insurance or similar contributions in respect of any payments for lessons provided to pupils of the School. The VMT will indemnify the School in respect of any claims made by the relevant authorities against the School in respect of income tax and National Insurance. The notice period for this role is half a term.

OBLIGATIONS OF THE VMT

Teaching one to one, paired and group music lessons for 30/45/60-minute durations.

The ability to lead a Senior String ensemble.

Preparing pupils for performances, examinations, and school events.

Keeping accurate record of student development and completing progress reports for parents.

Regularly communicating with parents regarding their child's lessons and progress.

Providing pupils with practice strategies to extend and encourage them to learn independently.

Offering taster sessions to publicise music lessons within the school.

To monitor, assess and report on pupils in accordance with appropriate Westonbirt Schools' Policies.
